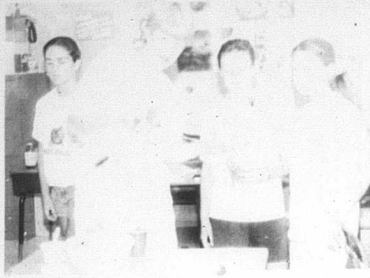


Kids college teaches real skills with fun included

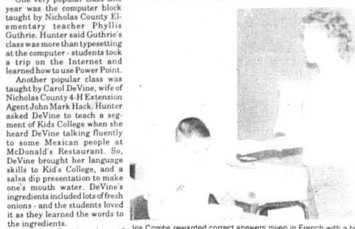
