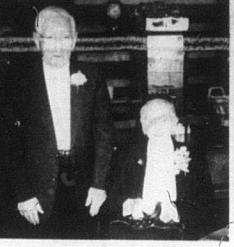

## NICHOLAS COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Nicholas County Board of Education has available for lease during the 1997-1998 school year 4,000 pounds of tobacco. Bids will be accepted for the entire amount until Friday, May 15 at 12 p.m. in the Nicholas County Board of Education office. Bids will specify price per pound of tobacco. Upon receipt of bids, the date and the time will be recorded on the envelope. In the event of similar high bids, the one which was received first will be accepted bid.

## PUBLIC NOTICE

The Nicholas County School District has recently prepared an application for the use of federal funds for the education of handicapped children in Nicholas County School District. This application will be provided to all handicapped students pre-school through age twenty-one who are residents of the Nicholas County School District. Public law 94-142 provides for priorities for the expenditure of funds. First priority is given to those children who are not receiving any educational services. It also requires that the school district plan for the implementation of identification, location, evaluation, and placement of all handicapped children. Guaranteed procedural safeguards for handicapped children and their parents in the decisions regarding identification, programs and confidentiality of files of those children identified as handicapped will continue to be instituted. This application is on file in the Office of the Director of Special Education for the Nicholas County Schools for a period of thirty days beginning on May 1, 1997 and ending May 30, 1997. This application must be submitted to the Kentucky Department of Education by June 6, 1997. The school district will accept all comments regarding the application until July 6, 1997, and will submit these comments to KDE as an addendum to the project.
