JMHC faces decisions about converting hospital beds

Johnston-McCormick Health Care is rapidly approaching a decision on whether to convert some of its hospital beds into nursing homes.

If that decision is made, the result will be a significant change in the health care facility composed of 110 beds.

In 1996, the Nicholas County Health Policy Board approved JMHC to add 50 new nursing home beds to accommodate the needs of Nicholas County.

Since 1992, there has been a continuous decline in hospital admissions at JMHC. That decline became dramatic in 1996.

Meanwhile the waiting list for admissions to the nursing home stands at about 140 persons.
