Center's Pediatric and Adolescent Injury Prevention Program Working with Material and Child Health at the State Department of Public Health, Pollak directs a statewide program which collects and analyzes injury and death statistics using them to initiate prevention programs to protect Kentucky children. Children have curiosity about and fascination with matches and lighters. Whittaker says that child-resistant lighters are a tough match for inventors and lighters are not child-proof. Children should be taught to leave them alone, but it is normal for children ages 1-4 to be unshelving at following directions. So there is no substitute for closely supervising your children and keeping matches and lighters out of reach. Pollak has seen people in their wanting match lighters to annoy their children. She points out that the child most likely who is given by a mother which teaches a dangerous lesson. Hughes said faulty electrical wiring is a common problem, usually found in older homes. We'd get calls for auto inspection. You have to be careful about wiring. If you're having problems with continuously blowing fuses you need to get an electrician.
