INSIGHTS FOR KNOWING AND DOING THE WILL OF GOD

We often have a difficult time understanding the concept of God's will. For example, we sometimes look back on a situation that has occurred which we cannot explain, and we say, "It must have been God's will." Is that the proper way that Christians should view the will of God? I think it is rather inadequate approach. Let me share with you some insights that may help develop a better understanding of what it means to know and do the will of God. First, we typically ask God questions like, "Lord, what do you want me to do? How do you want me to do it? When do you want me to do it? What do you want the outcome if I do it?" We expect answers to these questions before we take any action or make any steps toward doing something for God. We want a detailed road map that we can follow in a clear, step by step fashion. This approach leaves faith completely out of the equation, and that is not how God operates.

In Genesis 12, God told Abraham to "go" to land that I will show you." He did not tell Abraham the location, what the land would be like, how long the journey would take, or what he would experience when he got there. He simply said, "Go." The Bible says that Abraham walked by faith, and not by sight, and he went. The first insight is this: Trusting God does not mean that you should not mean having all the answers up front.

Jesus said, "I am the way." John 14:6 He did not say, "I will show you the way, if you give me a detailed road map so you can discover the way. I will tell you which direction he'd." He said, "I am the way."

Increased storms possible

Sandwiched between polar air from the north and tropical air to the south, Kentucky and the Ohio Valley could experience "roller coaster" temperatures and more ice storms than the norm according to Jim Fridly, meteorologist for the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.

"Temperatures likely will hover around freezing when low pressure storm system comes through the area," he said. "This will produce an increase in sleet and ice rather than heavy rain and snow."

Fridly attributes the probability of increased ice storms to a combination of factors that could create weather conditions conducive to these storms.

One is a dramatic and unprecedented increase in tropical sea surface temperatures in the equatorial Pacific (El Niño) this summer during the time these temperatures normally decrease.

This deviation will affect the jet stream - upper air currents that direct global storm patterns. As a result, Fridly believes a sub-tropical jet stream will flow across the southern U.S. or the polar jet stream will shift, forming a southern branch. Either condition will produce warm, moist air - keeping winter temperatures fairly mild in Kentucky and the Ohio Valley. The southern jet stream will also generate vigorous storms producing low pressures systems south of, but near Kentucky, with the potential for increased ice storms, along or near the storm movement.
