Child abuse is serious problem in Kentucky

April is Child Abuse Prevention month, a time when families and communities are reminded to protect and care for children and to be aware of potential abusive situations.

The Kentucky Council on Child Abuse, Inc. has compiled an information pamphlet on what to consider in child abuse, warning signs that may tell you abuse is occurring, the reasons why child abuse happens, and what to do in case you suspect someone is abusing their child.

The pamphlet states that there are at least five types of abuse: physical, sexual, emotional and verbal and indicates that abuse may consist of one or more of these acts of violence.

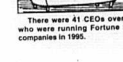
The Cabinet for Families & Children Department, for Social Services, released a statement declaring the number of child abuse reports for Kentucky for the fiscal year in 1998.

The release states that in 1998, 40,966 cases of suspected child abuse and neglect were reported to the Department for Social Services (DSS) in Kentucky, and of that number, 16,879 of the children were substantiated as abuse or neglect victims.

The reports goes on to include the number of incidents that were substantiated by the type of abuse, stating that 16,299 were cases of neglect, 7,122 were cases of physical abuse and 2,042 were sexual abuse victims.

According to the data collected by the DSS Director, the Bluegrass region of the state reported 3,407 substantiated cases of child abuse, one of the largest numbers in the four-state regions surveyed.

Ronnie Finney is the founder of the Blue Ribbon Campaign, an awareness campaign unique to the state that encourages the public to help children at the hands of an abusive parent.

U.S. Senator Wendell Ford (D-KY) announced Thursday, April 9, that the Department of Justice has awarded a \$250,000 grant to Kentucky's Crime Victims Compensation Board.

The grant provides funds from the FY97 Crime Victims Fund, established by the 1984 Victims of Crime Act and will be used to increase Kentucky's victim compensation payments to eligible crime victims.
