Burley sales volume down in third week

Burley sales volume in the third week of the season was down 6 percent, and 23 percent increased, and 23 percent was unchanged. A top bid of \$205 per hundred was reported for a few upper stalk grades, but most sales ranged between \$185 and \$203 per hundred.

Quality of offerings was lower this week, and lower leaf grade demand was also lower. Quality percentages were fine 2, good 23, C-3, and low quality 21 percent. Lugs accounted for 21 percent, and 14 percent of all sales were ten to eleven.

The Burley Cooperative received 47 percent of gross sales during the third week, and 3.9 percent for the week. Total sales were 96,657,375 pounds this week, and 300,484,851 pounds so far this season.

The majority of burley grades sold averaged a ton a downward trend during the third week of sales. In overall volume, 66 percent declined. Seventeen percent increased, and 23 percent was unchanged. Total sales were 96,657,375 pounds this week, and 300,484,851 pounds so far this season.

A 31-year-old man was killed in a side-vehicle crash in Lewis County Friday. Kentucky State Police Dept. 8 on Morehead said.

Rodney Price, 31, of Garrison, a passenger in a 1978 Chevy pickup truck, was killed in the crash on KY at Quincy at 10 p.m.

The driver of the pickup, Robert Ervin, 30, of Quincy, was charged with DUI 1st by state police, in connection with the crash.

Industrial park plan approved for KY 801

A plan for the design of the 60.3-acre industrial park located on KY 801 has received approval from its authority. The master plan for the \$5.5 million, 500-acre park calls for a 41-acre office center in the middle of the park which could house a training, employment center, a recreational complex, a day care center, a fire station and a picnic area built around a pond that currently exists on the property.

The site of the industrial park is the old Canada Coal farm, formerly owned by Roy Canada. His business is now called Maple Leaf Landings. Representatives from Mays, Suddeth and Elberberg, a planning firm in Lexington, prepared the map. This firm is also designing the same type of county industrial park in Morgan County.

The plan calls for the park to be divided into 16 industrial and commercial lots. Their sizes would range from 1.4 to 14.7 acres.

Four injured in KY 32 crash

There were four injuries in a two-vehicle crash on KY 32, just west of Morehead Saturday. Kentucky State Police Post 8 in Morehead said the accident occurred at 2:45 a.m.

Wayne Maynard, 36, of Holly Fork Road, Morehead, was driving an eastbound 1987 Ford Aerostar van, when the vehicle hydroplaned.

The van then crossed left of center and collided head-on with a westbound 1996 Dodge Caravan, driven by Rhonda Beck, 39, of Frenchburg, according to police.

Maynard and three passengers in her van were taken to St. Claire Medical center in Morehead, 24. Morehead of Bowen County and Savannah Glasgow, 12, of KY 801 North, Bowen County, suffered multiple injuries. Eric Beck, 11, of Holly Fork Road, Morehead, sustained a back injury.

Beck and a passenger in her car, Leah Beck, 14, of Frenchburg, were not injured.
