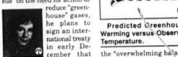
New Weapons For Fighting Flu

(NAPS)—Influenza results in millions of lost workdays and 20,000 deaths annually, but Americans may finally be making strides in fighting the flu. According to the most recent National Health Interview Survey, 51 percent of American adults received immunization against the flu. These flu shots, which are readily available through the family doctor or local health organization, may prevent or lessen the severity of the flu by 70 to 90 percent. In addition, medical researchers are currently testing two promising new medications that can shorten and even prevent an attack of influenza. Despite their success against influenza, neither the flu shot nor these new medications will guard against viral gastroenteritis, commonly known as the "stomach flu."

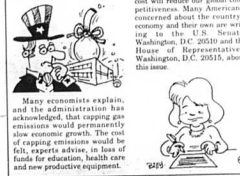

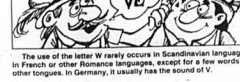

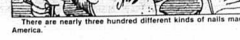
