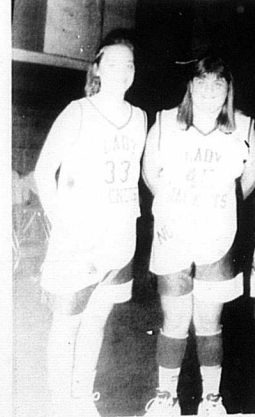

Red Skelton's career spanned several decades

(NAPS)—He was one of entertainment's most beloved clowns, with a career that spanned decades on Broadway, radio, film and television.

But Red Skelton, who passed away Sept. 17, 1997, at age 84, was equally renowned for his work on behalf of Shriner's Hospitals. Skelton raised more than \$250,000 for the hospitals every year through donations of items such as work boots, memorabilia and music to the International Shrine Clown Association's Swank Fund. He also copied visiting patients at Shriner's Hospital.

One of Skelton's final public appearances came in 1996, when he filmed a segment for the Shriner's Hospital 50th Anniversary television special.

Skelton had been a Mason since 1939 in his hometown of Vincennes, Indiana. He received the Scottish Rite's top honor, the George Mead, on July 14, 1995. Two months before his death, he was awarded the Imperial Potentate's Award of Merit during the Shriner's 123rd Imperial Council Session in St. Louis.

Clowning was a family tradition for Richard Bernard Skelton. His father, who died two months before Red was born on July 15, 1913, had been a circus clown. His mother taught him an appreciation for art that would lead to a lucrative side business as a painter. She also gave him tickets to vaudeville shows, which led him to his career.

At age 10, Skelton left home to join a traveling medicine show. By 1927, he had made his radio and Broadway debut, and began his film career a year later.

Skelton made 63 films in all, and in the 1940s starred in a successful series of comedies, including "The Fuller Brush Man" and "A Southern Yankee."
