Work at Home offers have moved first to the number one position as the most inquired about industry at your letter. Based on 1997 statistical data, consumers called the BBB in record numbers to check out the reliability of work at home offers, and every industry that offers a "work at home" opportunity is being scrutinized. In fact, the BBB predicts there "nothing for nothing" offers to be the top scums of the year, with mystery shoppers, coupon clippers and computer cleaners emerging as the newest variations of work at home offers. More than 66,000 calls rang in with little more than half the inquiries to BBB's past year. In two years time, complaints about each of these professions doubled, while the handful of customers who did complain had their problems resolved nearly 100 percent of the time.

All fired up
New home builders among biggest gain in complaints

Aluminum/Ductwork quality, pined in the number of complaints from the 79th most complained about industry in 1996 to the 20th spot in 1997, while mobile home dealers scored 16 spots to settle in at the number one position and Plumbing Companies moved 15 spots to number one. Among the industries showing the biggest gain in complaints last year were Department Stores and New Home Builders. The two most notable examples of industries cleaning up their acts and focusing on customer service were drycleaners and lawnmower care specialists. In two years time, complaints about each of these professions doubled, while the handful of customers who did complain had their problems resolved nearly 100 percent of the time. Work at Home offers and Home Remodeling Companies, Auto Repair Shops, and Franchised Auto Dealers, ranked in the top five most asked about industries as compared to the previous year. However, year-end statistical analysis showed some industries were on the move in 1997.
