### Robertson County elected officials face serious salary problems

House Bill 810, a law which went into effect Wednesday, July 15, may spell trouble for Robertson County's elected officials. The bill will determine the salaries for the sheriff, county clerk and justice of the peace. The bill will also determine the salaries for the sheriff, county clerk and justice of the peace. With the new law, officials in every county are to receive a statutory amount based on their county's population. The bill was originally presented by the County Clerk's Association. Robertson County Judge Executive Wayne Buckler has held his office for twelve years. His salary for this fiscal year is \$31,500, the highest elected official salary paid in the county.

Buckler has never received the maximum pay for his office because the county has not been able to afford the increase. Due to the loss of the primary election, the county will not be forced to raise the judge-executive's pay for an anniversary meeting. Robertson County's Fiscal Administrator, who is paid a salary of \$44,666. This new bill still remains concerned for the county in that he still receives \$13,165 more than what the bill allows.

Lukins pleaded not guilty and is being held at the Fayette County Detention Center. He is being held on a \$100,000 bail cash bond.
