Morehead legal services merges with similar group Provides aide to poor

Northwest Kentucky Legal Services, Inc. has merged with The Northern Kentucky Legal Aid Society, Inc. to form Greater Cincinnati United Way and Community United Way. Both agencies were founded in 1967. The merged entity will have a budget of approximately \$1.5 million. Both Boards of Directors are now consolidated into one, and the board members anticipate that by linking office expertise and some economy of scale savings inherent in the merger that low income persons residing in the 23 county area will have improved access to justice.

The merged entity now provides 15 full time attorneys dedicated to the needs of the poor in the service area.

Most cases they accept will be to protect persons from domestic violence, to establish a custody or visitation matter, to secure or maintain housing or utility service, to secure or maintain a public benefit such as Social Security Disability or Medicaid, or to protect persons from abusive consumer practices.

The merged entity will keep the Northern Kentucky Legal Aid Society, Inc. as its office name. It will be directed by Richard A. Callison who has served in that role for Northern Kentucky Legal Aid since 1984 and has been directing both programs since September of 1997.
