Blood transfusions are recommended by your physician to replace blood lost during surgery, to assure blood levels during chemotherapy treatment, for cancer, for revascularization of arteries to improve blood flow, and to correct iron deficiency anemia. It is important that you understand your options if you or a family member will need a transfusion.

NOTICE OF EXPLANATION FLOODPLAINS AND WETLANDS PROTECTION

The City of Carlsle, Kentucky intends to undertake the redevelopment of the Dorseville Neighborhood. This project is needed to eliminate substandard housing and highest conditions in the project area. In order to complete the project, it will be necessary to construct new drainage and road improvements within the 100 year floodplain. A portion of a new private park area will be located in the 100-year floodplain. Homes in the project which are located in the floodplain will be required and the residential structures in the city which are not in the floodplain. Due to the city's location near Branch Fork, there is a potential alternative to the proposed project. The proposed improvements will conform to all applicable state floodplain standards. Every effort will be made to minimize the impact of work in the floodplain. The proposed action will affect natural or beneficial floodplain values as it represents an adverse impact on the floodplain.

The reasons for such decisions not to prepare such Statement are as follows:

There are no wetlands, prime farmlands or threatened and endangered species in the project area. The floodplain is not adversely affected. Four sites or parcels for the National Register of Historic Places will be affected by the project. Two of those sites will be documented prior to demolition. Two others will be rehabilitated by the Secretary of the Interior Standards. In order to reduce the impact of noise from the railroad, no new homes will be built unless noise levels are acceptable for the site. Noise attenuation features will be incorporated as appropriate into homes to be rehabilitated. Other effects such as an increase in dust and possible soil erosion during construction will be minimal and short term.

An Environmental Review Report respecting the within project has been made by the above-named City of Carlsle which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Report on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request between the hours of 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM. No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by Carlsle to the Mayor of Carlsle, 107 East Chestnut Street, Carlsle, Kentucky 40311. Such written comments should be received at the Mayor's office no later than May 22, 1998. All such comments are received will be considered and will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified on the preceding notice.

Carlsle will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the Kentucky Department of Local Government (KDLG) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Carlsle certifies to the Mayor that Carlsle and Ronnie Clark, in his official capacity as Mayor, do not accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental review, location making, and action, and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, Carlsle may use the Block Grant funds and that the State will be satisfied their responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. The State will accept no objection to its approval if it is one of the following bases:

(a) The certification was not in fact executed by the City's Certifying Officer.

(b) The City had failed to make one of the two findings required by 265.41 or to make the written determination decision pursuant to 265.47, or (c) the City had failed to follow the steps set forth at Subpart 7 and G for the preparation and completion of an EA.

(d) No opportunity was given to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation or the Executive Director to review the effect of the project on a property listed on the National Historic Historic Register or found to be eligible for such listing by the Secretary of the Interior, in accordance with 267.78 Part 600.

(e) Objections have been made by a Federal Agency.

Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58) and may be addressed to the Kentucky Department for Local Government, Division of Community Development, 3024 Capital Center Drive, Suite 340, Frankfort, Kentucky 40621.

(f) Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by the State. No objection received after June 10, 1998 will be considered by the State.

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On or about May 26, 1998 the above-named City of Carlsle will request the Secretary of the Department of Local Government to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 85-809).

Dorseville Redevelopment Project. The purpose of this project is to improve the Spring Street area of Dorseville. The project will include the Dorseville Neighborhood by removing dilapidated structures in the area and rehabilitating existing structures into modern, approximately 100-unit town houses. 15 structures will be cleared and 52 town houses will be relocated into standard housing. Five town houses will be rehabilitated to meet the Secretary of the Interior Standards. In order to reduce the impact of noise from the railroad, no new homes will be built unless noise levels are acceptable for the site. Noise attenuation features will be incorporated as appropriate into homes to be rehabilitated. Other effects such as an increase in dust and possible soil erosion during construction will be minimal and short term.
