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




## Local church to send eight on mission trip to Russia

The First Baptist Church of Russell Springs is sending eight members on a mission trip to Russia this summer. The two-week project will be June 22-30. The group will be helping build a church in the city of Krasnoyarsk, near the cultural city of St. Petersburg.

The project is part of a partnership between Kentucky Baptists and Russian Baptists. During the four-year partnership, "volunteers from churches in Kentucky have gone to aid in construction of new churches, medical projects, leadership training, and evangelistic projects. More than 1,300 volunteers have made the trip to date, helping to build forty churches in the Moscow and St. Petersburg areas.

Members of the First Baptist Church making the trip will be Rev. Kevin and Gayle Thomas, Ron and Candace Baker, Gill Leason Boggs, Becky Castle and Diana Willis. In addition to helping with the church build, the group will be working with children, singing, giving testimonies, handing out Bibles and sharing their faith with the Russian people.

Local Baptists have also participated in projects to Russia and Brazil over the last fifteen years. In addition, members of the church have been involved in several more local and regional projects in recent years. Last summer seventeen members of the "Jimmy Carter National Work Project" through Habitat for Humanity in Rowan County. Missions work has always been an important focus for the church.

Russia is the largest geographical country in the world, spanning eleven time zones within its borders. Only during the past decade has a project like this been possible in the former communist empire, which has a population of 160 million people.

It is uncertain how long this "mission" will last, but it will remain open in Russia. Already pressure is being exerted by the Russian Orthodox church and 150 million adherents to limit, if not stop altogether, the flow of evangelistic groups into the country. Such groups are seen as a threat to the traditional Orthodox religion.

In a country struggling for identity in a new era of freedom, it is a very unprecedented time in Russian history. This decade has seen more evangelistic work in Russia than in the previous 120 years.

The need for projects such as this is heightened by the fact that the door to such activity "could close at any time."

Members of the First Baptist Church are supporting this project in many ways, including a recently published outlook of the congregation's favorite "get-together" dinner recipe. The books are available for a donation of \$10.00 toward the Russia project, and can be purchased by contacting Rev. Kevin Thomas at 289-0606, or at Trucks Restaurant.

**Household Help by John Amanates**

The plumbing experts at Ron-Jucker recommend that you visually inspect all rooms in your home that utilize water to ensure that your pipes are functioning properly. Following is a spring cleaning checklist to help you:

- Change all water filters on filtration systems and kettles.
- If your shower has weak or uneven pressure, try soaking the shower head in vinegar to remove mineral buildup and increase water pressure.
- Flush the toilet to make sure they work properly, also checking that the water is not continuously running. If the water is running, check the float handle to see the float ball and the water stops rising. If the water continues to rise, turn off the water main and replace as necessary.
- Outside:
  - Be sure down spouts are cleaned and free of leaves and debris.
  - Check your yard drains and clear any obstructions.
  - Check all faucets and hose bibs to make sure water is flowing freely.

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## Farmers want for conservation program

Farmers who want to preserve a farm for future generations are being encouraged to apply for a new farm development program. The program is designed to help farmers preserve their land for future generations while still allowing them to use the land for agriculture.

One development right is the farm's permanent easement, which is available to developers. Farmers can also apply to the State Department of Agriculture by June 1.

The General Assembly created the Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easements Program in 1994 as a way for farmers to preserve farmland permanently. Under the program, farmers may apply to sell their state development rights to the state. Once an agreement is reached, the land will be off limits for developers but may be used for agricultural purposes.
