Jensen wins 1st place in KAEA art competition

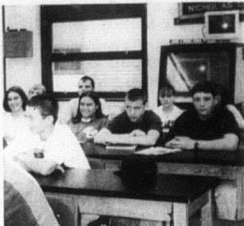

Freshman Orientation conducted at Nicholas County High School

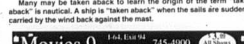
