Moisture and decorative wood work don't die, they just pass on. Slices of scale with different moldings can give you definition between rooms, when you may not have any walls, according to Chicago interior designer Martine Rostand. "All in may take a change of molding on the ceiling or a floor level."

When you're faced with hardwood moldings, you'll find a wide range of choices to fit your budget. You can custom-order decorative hardwoods through your architect, contractor or interior designer, or through mill work stores, local lumber yards and custom cabinet shops. You can find them, too, at local lumber yards and home centers, or through mail order specialty catalogues.

Favorite decorating tips:
• Molding chosen depend on the size and scale of your room. Crown moldings, for example, work best in rooms where the ceilings are eight feet or higher. Choose narrower moldings for smaller rooms, wider ones for larger rooms.
• Molding should be widest at the top level, becoming progressively narrower as they approach the ceiling.
• If you want visual continuity and flow, combine the same molding pattern in adjacent rooms, especially if there's an unimpeded view from room to room. For example, the crown molding you choose for your formal living room.
• Hardwood moldings add a touch class even to a plain drywall ceiling. For example, crown molding in classic, dense, ornate embossed sophistication and elegance.
• Running from 25 to 42 inches above the floor, chair rails protect walls from chair backs and can signal a change in wall covering. For instance, the upper half may be paneled while the lower half is wallpapered.
• Go ahead and mix grain patterns, sizes and colors in your moldings, flooring and furnishings. Variety in color and finishes adds drama to a room.

Diploma or GED? Study Says Diploma's Worth More
NAPSI—If you know a high school student who is thinking of dropping out of school, this news from the Department of Education and have more job turnover than might be worth reading.

A new study by analysts in the U.S. Department of Education shows that while GEDs do better than dropouts, they do not do as well as high school graduates. A restricted GED enrollment.

GED is a General Educational Development certification. It is a high school equivalency that diploma can get by passing a test.

The study shows that GED recipients are much more likely to attend college than dropouts, are more likely to be employed full-time, and tend to earn more.

However, the study notes that GED recipients generally do not do as well as high school graduates in the labor market, or in the military. While they are roughly equivalent to high school graduates in their basic thinking skills, they are not equivalent in many other respects. They are less likely to go to college and less likely to finish if they do though they earn about the same grades.
