routine is right for them. A mammogram may not slightly increase your risk of dying from breast cancer, but it does increase your chance of finding the disease early. 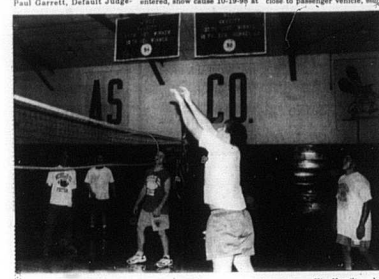
