Dear Editor:  
**ANOTHER VIETNAM**  
**PARADE**

It is now being said in most political commentary on the war that we are going to need ground troops to win it. The Clinton administration is indicating the call up of some 50,000 reservists and appropriation of some \$6 billion, for example. Now, it is our young sons and daughters and not just the professional force at risk. In Viet Nam we suffered some 58,000 dead, and over 100,000 serious other casualties and, for what, since we had a no-win policy in that war as we also had in Korea.

There is a media campaign on to portray all the atrocities on the Serb side when there is documented evidence of numerous atrocities committed by the KLA. What we hear in the dominant media is what supports the agenda. What heard during the Bosnian war was that the Bosnian Muslims crucified seventeen young Croatians and at some 40,000 Croatian young girls and women into rape camps. And who has heard that the KLA has been recognized for years by Interpol as a terrorist organization which finances its operations by pipeline heroin from the Middle East into Europe and is backed by Iran and the terrorist Osama bin-Ladin who, after we attacked his camp in Afghanistan, got a bounty on the heads of Americans throughout the world? Another example: Clinton and the dominant media alleged a Serbian massacre of ethnic Albanians in the village of Racak by way of preparing us to accept military intervention. A French television crew on the scene reported that, after a firefight with the Serbs, the KLA dressed their dead in civilian clothes and piled them into a truck and then played it to the world press as a massacre. This was verified by a team of Finnish physicians.

All this is not to take the side of Milosevic or the Serbs. It is only to say that we are not getting the full truth necessary to make such a serious decision as war, and both sides are evil. I agree that the forced evacuation of the ethnic Albanians from their homes which Milosevic did in response to the bombing is a terrible atrocity. We should

provide humanitarian aid, but failing to do so has only increased the problem. The Serbs are negotiating and world public opinion, which was sure to succeed if it did not include the de facto occupation and dismemberment of the country which the previous negotiations required, a condition to which the Serbs would agree. Clinton is highly intelligent, and he understands all about how to manipulate people in politics. But he doesn't know much about human nature or history if he thought he could intimidate the Serbs in less than an all-out war. Unfortunately, there is no correlation between intelligence and wisdom. Look at what "the best and the brightest" have gotten us into in the past forty years. When the left wing in Congress essentially said that "character doesn't count" and gave Clinton a pass on the impeachment, they left him free to unilaterally take us to an appointment.

It's been said, when you find yourself in a hole, stop digging. We have no responsibility to preserve Clinton's mediocrity of the nation, with what billions of blood and treasure. In fact, around the world there is a great deal of opposition to Clinton. In the American South, particularly in the South, where he started World War III. With these people, to recognize this war as a bad policy and withdraw would preserve the American credibility, so necessary to preserving the peace.
