His memory would become mixed with characters and events that would later unfold on words on pages. That boy grew up. The town he grew up in. The people he grew up with. There is no longer a tip of toe for Haldeman. It's history. But a new history has emerged from the town the famous road and sometimes, rebellion. It has produced a famous Kentucky writer, Chris Offutt.

Offutt received national acclaim for the first three books: "Kentucky Straight," "The Same River Twice," and "The Good Brother." Currently, "Out of the Woods," his fourth book which tells of his time in Haldeman, has also received nothing but good reviews from large media outlets such as "The New York Times" and "Newsday." Now, that says something. One of the woods' main theme of short stories straight out of these familiar hills. The common theme thread that runs through the stories is the flight of Kentuckians who have left here and long for home. Characters in his stories struggle between loving the land and desperately wanting to leave it for their support.
