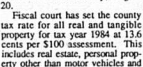

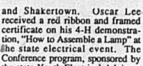

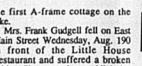

Peelver, wins third state junior golf title

Jester Park Golf Course has become a favorite of Keokuk's Cole Peelver.

Peelver, 12, won the Iowa Golf Association (IGA) State Junior Golf Championship in the 12-13 age Tuesday, July 20. It was his third IGA state junior title in four years on the golf course in Des Moines.

"It's a nice course, the greens are in very good shape," Peelver said. "I'm glad to play pretty well there."

Peelver shot an even par 71 in the division by five strokes over Dubuque's Zach Rice and Peoria's Nathan Croce. Peelver's 71 was his best round of the season blitting off the men's tees.

Peelver won the tournament on the back nine. He birdied the 10th and 11th holes. After three straight bogeys, he made birdie on 12 and finished the hole with a bogey. However, he quickly got back on the short back with a birdie on 17. He finished the back-nine with a two under par 33.

"I was hitting the ball straight, and I punted well," he said of his success. "I just hit the ball well."

The game of golf seems to come a third place plaque in the first flight. He shot an 80 at the Keokuk Country Club in the city tournament, which said "The want to play with it, but in a tournament situation, competing against men who have played in this tournament before, that's a pretty good score."

Peelver tied his father, Gary, with a 154, but Cole was able to take the plaque home.

"I thought it was pretty funny," Cole said about winning the plaque over his dad. "It was fun to play in the tournament. I was happy with my first day."

"Determination is becoming a very big factor with Cole," Biel said. "He really wants to play well. He wants to work, and if he has a problem, he wants to get it fixed. He is understanding what he should do and he's growing and getting stronger."
