Students Enrolled Fall 1999 at LCC

Mandatory Academic Advising - January 4-19, 2000

Late Registration - January 7-19, 2000

Continuing students who do not participate in priority registration may late register. Instructions for late registration are on the following page.

1. Students must meet with an academic advisor to have the advisor hold lifted. All students should report to the Lobby of the Oswald Building according to the following schedule:

2. After you have discussed your proposed schedule with your academic advisor, prepare a VIP worksheet. It is a good idea to have a plan on paper before calling VIP. VIP worksheets are available from your academic advisor, the Student Records Office (203 Oswald Building) or the Advising and Assessment Center (109 Oswald Building).

3. January 7-19
 • Register for your classes using VIP. Note special hours for VIP on January 10 and 11.

4. Pay your fees. Fees are due in full by January 10, 2000. If you register after January 10, you are encouraged to pay your fees at the time of registration. However, the absolute deadline for fee payment for students who register after January 10 is as follows:

Friday, January 14	Students who registered January 11-14
Wednesday, January 19	Students who registered January 15-19

Failure to pay your fees will result in cancellation of your registration.

The Financial Aid Application Process

All students applying for any type of financial aid are required to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To complete your financial aid file, you must also submit any required financial aid transcripts. Pell Grant and Federal Direct Student Loans are the only sources of financial aid available to students applying for the Spring Semester.

Please be advised that it takes four to six weeks to process the FAFSA. It will take additional time after that to process your file and issue awards. Additional information about financial aid programs and about the application process is contained in the LCC financial aid application materials which are available upon request from the Financial Aid Office (Room 121 OB).
