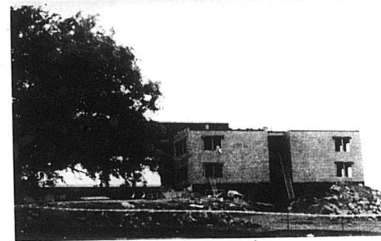

Lane to retire at end of school year

Superintendent Greg Reed informed board members at Monday night Nicholas County Board of Education regular meeting that James H. Lane, Director of Pupil Personnel and Transportation Director will retire after the 1999 school year. The board voted 5-0 to pay Lane thirty percent of his accumulated sick leave as permitted by Board policy with \$15,000 to be paid to the Kentucky Employees Deferred Compensation System and the remainder paid directly to him. Reed also informed the board of James Lally transfer to Nicholas County Elementary School is complete. The board approved the payment of \$258,745.50 to D. W.

Wilburn, Inc. as partial payment for the renovations being made at the Nicholas County High School. The renovation is scheduled to be completed before students return to school next school year. 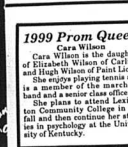
