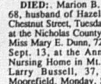

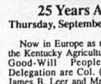

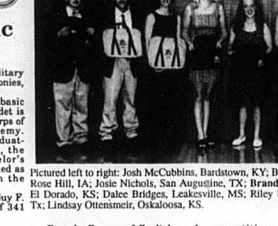
Frost led the Founders Day Parade on August 28, 1998. After the parade he was honored in a ceremony in his home.

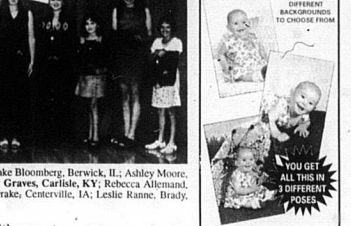
