Who Is Sacagawea?
President Thomas Jefferson sent Meriwether Lewis and Lt. William Clark on an expedition to chart a passage from St. Louis through the Northwest Territory to the Pacific Ocean. Lewis and Clark departed with a troop of men, on the Sagraway trail through uncharted land inhabited by numerous Native American Indian tribes. Along the way they recruited a guide, a Shoshone Indian woman, Sacagawea, and with her infant son, Baptiste, equipped to her back the necessary food for the expedition westward.

From 1804-1806 "Jenny" as she was called by Lt. Clark acted as a guide, translator, and negotiator between various tribes and the explorers. Her presence as an Indian woman and diplomat, along with her knowledge of the terrain and the tribal leaders of the expedition, was most importantly, guaranteed their safe passage.

In 1931, Sacagawea's role in the discovery and opening of the Northwest Passage by the Bureau of the Mint recently issued a new gold-colored \$1.00 coin bearing her likeness and that of her son, Baptiste, on her back.
