The 1960's was an era that some labeled a time dominated by the "Hippies". During that period, songwriter Sydney Carter took a Shaker tune "This Gift to be Simple" and used it again. We now find in our 1989 United Methodist Hymnal, No. 261, the Hymn, "Lord of the Dance." Some have found this song able to open for them a whole new perception of Jesus. Finding ourselves moving through the Season of Lent and into Holy Week, don't we at times wish that the week preceding Easter, did not feel so lacking in passion, or our Easter, so
