Some of us can still remember when delivery of things like milk and groceries were made by horse-drawn wagons. As a child growing up in such an era I made a mistake once that my family loves to tease me about. Running into the house I announced, "There's half a horse on the sidewalk." My mother, certain that some dreadful accident had happened and a horse had been killed, ran from the house only to find a perfectly ordinary, healthy horse drawing a milk van. The horse had been attracted by some fresh grass in a neighbor's yard and had straddled up so that its front hooves were on the pavement while its hind legs were still on the street. Everyone laughed and told me that I should have said that there was a horse, half on the pavement. (You know, it just now occurs to me that if you don't put the comma in there between "horse" and "half" it is just as silly to say that there is a horse half on the pavement as it is to say there is half a horse.) It was an early lesson learned in the intricacies of the English language-and one

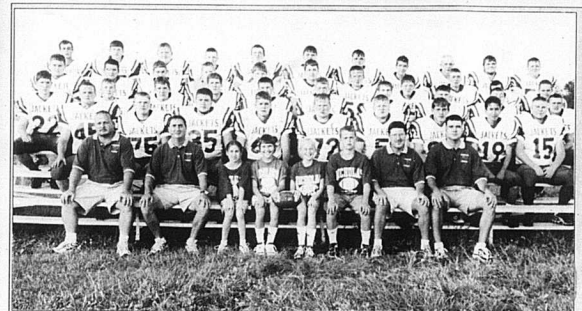

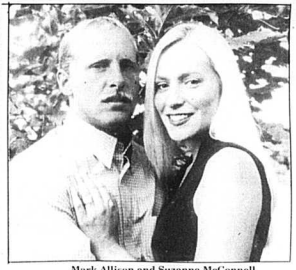
