huge game for the Bluejackets, and started the assault with a 45-yard punt return the first time Nicholas County touched the football. His run gave Nicholas County the football at the Fairview 23.

After two incomplete passes and a two-yard run, junior Josh Hunt broke free on a fourth down run for a first down at the Fairview 20.

Both a run by Herrington and a pass from Josh Fryman to Seth Saunders picked up big yardage, but the Bluejackets were flagged for blocking penalties down field and Nicholas County forced a first down-and-19.

Dustin Hill rambled down to the two and Herrington scored on the next play for a 6-0 lead at the 14:37 mark.

After the kickoff, Fairview fumbled on its first play and Fryman recovered at the Eagle eight. The Bluejackets needed three plays before Eric Earlywine bulled in at the 13:40 mark. Fryman booted the conversion for a 13-0 lead.

Fairview was penalized on the kickoff return and on first down. Nicholas County's Derek Fights nailed Fairview's Roger Kaylor for a seven-yard loss to the Fairview seven.

After forcing a punt, the Bluejackets started their third possession at the Fairview 36. Fryman had a long run wiped out by a blocking penalty. Even after the walk-off, the Bluejackets made four yards and had the ball at the 32.

Saunders broke free on a run to the three. Hill scored on the next play with 10:03 to go. Herrington ran the conversion as the lead went to 21.

With some of the reserves sprinkled in the Nicholas County defense, Fairview began to move the ball. The Eagles had the ball for 15 plays and moved to the Nicholas County 13. On fourth-and-3, Earlywine came up to drop Kaylor for a yard

loss. Fryman came out throwing with 2:13 left in the half. He connected with Saunders for 12 yards and Herrington for 11 to move the ball to the 37.

After a Nicholas County penalty, Hill broke free on a 68-yard touchdown run. However, another down field blocking penalty brought the play back to the Nicholas County 29.

Josh Hunt went 11 yards on the next play and Fryman followed with a 60-yard completion to Saunders for a 27-0 score at the 1:09 mark.

After fumbling the ball away on their first play for scrimmage in the second half, the Bluejackets got the ball back at their own 14. On the first play, Herrington broke at least three tackles before popping free behind the Fairview secondary.

Any hopes Fairview had of catching Herrington were wiped out by a crushing block by Hunt. He wiped out the only two Fairview defenders that had any chance of catching Herrington.

The 86-yard run with Herrington and the two-point conversion by Richard Heid gave Nicholas County a 35-0 lead with 14:25 left.

Fairview went 64 yards on eight plays for its only score. Kaylor scored on a 33-yard run at the 8:11 mark to cut the lead to 25-6.

The Nicholas County reserves answered, going 68 yards in 10 plays. Adam Hunter, Dustin Stoddard and Justin Tubbs took turns running the ball with Hunter scoring from the 24 with 1:35 to set the final score.

Eight different plays ran the ball for Nicholas County and amassed 231 yards. Fryman connected on half of his eight passes for 91 yards. The Bluejackets did a very good job covering kicks as Fairview started three of its possessions inside the 20.

Independent Auditor's Report

We have audited the accompanying statement of receipts, disbursements, and excess fees of the County Clerk of Nicholas County, Kentucky, for the year ended December 31, 1999. This financial statement is the responsibility of the County Clerk. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on this financial statement based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, and the Audit Guide for County Clerks Officially issued by the Auditor of Public Accounts, Commonwealth of Kentucky. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement, on a net basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statement. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, the County Clerk's office is required to prepare the financial statement on a prescribed basis of accounting that does not conform with the cash basis and laws of Kentucky, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. This cash basis system does not require the maintenance of a general fixed asset group or general long-term debt group of accounts. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statement is not intended to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the financial statement referred to above presents fairly, in all material respects, the receipts, disbursements, and excess fees of the County Clerk for the year ended December 31, 1999, in conformity with the basis of accounting described above.

In accordance with the Kentucky Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued a report dated June 7, 2000, on our consideration of the County Clerk's compliance with certain laws and regulations and internal control over financial reporting.
