By virtue of a Default Judgment and Order of Sale of the Nicholas Circuit Court entered in the above styled action on October 26, 2000, and to make enough money to satisfy said judgment lien and costs in the amount of \$81,323.36, plus judgment interest, court costs, including costs of sale, and unpaid ad valorem property taxes, as provided in said judgment, the undersigned Master Commissioner will on the 9th day of December, 2000, at about the hour of 10:00 a.m. at the Nicholas County Courthouse, in Carlisle, Kentucky, offer for sale to the highest and best bidder, that property in Nicholas County, Kentucky, described as follows:

"Four certain tracts or parcels of land located in Nicholas County, Kentucky and bounded and described as follows:

"First Tract: A certain tract or parcel of land, lying in Nicholas County, Kentucky, on the waters of Big Branch and bounded and abuted as follows: viz:

"BEGINNING at a corner stake in the middle of the Mt. Zion Church next to the Mt. Zion Church Let; thence with the line of Isaac Flora, now Pauline Hopkins to come of same; thence with the same line to a corner to Mat Maloney (now George Clavel) and said Pauline Hopkins; thence with George Clavel's line to a corner in the center of Mt.
