of the partial eclipse will occur around 12:28, according to Shubinski.

The moon will begin to move across the disk of the sun around 10:53 a.m. By 12:28 p.m., the moon will block approximately 40 percent of the sun's surface. That's the most we will see from Kentucky. By 2:05, the eclipse will be over," he says.

HAZARDOUS VIEWING Shubinski advises that viewing the partial eclipse can be harmful.

"At no time during the eclipse will it be safe to look directly at the sun," he warns.

"If you look directly at the sun, it can damage your eyes, but you may not notice any changes for several days or weeks. Looking at an eclipse can cause both partial and total blindness. It's not something to mess around with."

He also cautions about getting a close-up view of the eclipse.

"If you own a telescope or received one for Christmas, under no circumstances look through the telescope at the sun. It will immediately blind you."

"The only thing I can

recommend is a No. 14 welder's glass. The glass will screen the sun's strong rays, according to Shubinski, but the glass by itself isn't enough. Spectators should use either a welder's mask or a homemade viewer. He recommends cutting a square shape in a large box and taping the welder's glass to the box.

One of the safest ways to view the eclipse is by pinhole projection, according to the science center director.
