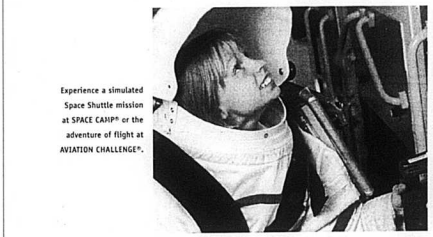

Help For Those Who Help Those With Alzheimer's

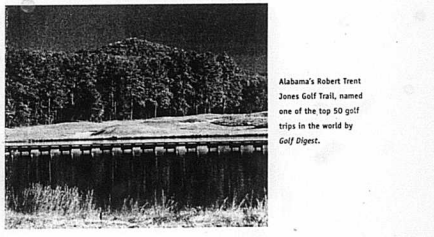
(NAPS)—A recent survey indicates the majority of American adults either are or expect to be a caregiver. Recent studies show that almost half the U.S. population has some kind of chronic condition. Of these, 41 million were limited in their daily activities; 12 million are unable to work, go to school or live independently.

- Often, the caregiver suffers almost as much as the patient. Among "intense" family caregivers that is those who provide at least 24 hours of care a week, 61 percent have suffered from depression. One illness that usually requires a great amount of caregiving is Alzheimer's disease. Nearly half of all Americans aged over 85 have Alzheimer's disease. For their caregivers, watching the illness rob loved ones of memory, abilities and personality can be both emotionally and physically daunting. Nevertheless, while facing their own sadness, disbelief and anxiety about the future, most caregivers still manage to dedicate their time and energy to creating a safe and comfortable environment for their loved ones. However, to acknowledge the love, care and support provided by Alzheimer's disease caregivers and to help those facing similar challenges learn from actual life experiences, the AD Caregiver Recognition Program has been developed. Each month, a caregiver will be profiled on an online community for Alzheimer's disease caregivers, developed by Novartis Pharmaceuticals Corporation at <http://www.AlzheimerDisease.com>. The caregiver selected each month will also get a \$100 gift certificate and an unrestricted education grant in his or her name will go to the National Family Caregiver Association. To be nominated, a caregiver must:
1. Be a friend or relative of an Alzheimer's disease patient, not a professional caregiver.
 2. Be responsible for the majority of the day-to-day care of an Alzheimer's disease patient who does not reside in a nursing home setting or other professional care center.
 3. Exemplify outstanding qualities of providing care such as dedication, patience and the ability to find creative solutions to common caregiving challenges.
 4. Exhibit attitudes and actions that suggest the caregiver also takes care of him/herself.
