Meeting Women's Needs

(NAPS)—Each day, about 7,000 U.S. women between the ages of 45 and 60 reach menopause. Some women, however, will reach menopause much earlier. When menopause occurs before age 40, it's considered "early menopause."



Early menopause (sometimes called "premature ovarian failure") means the end of childbearing, which can be a source of distress for some women. For women, being fertile may be linked with their femininity and sexual desirability. For all women, there are other consequences of early menopause. The earlier menopause occurs, the more years that will be spent without the protective effects of estrogen. Women reaching menopause before age 40 have an increased risk for bone-thinning osteoporosis and cardiovascular disease. Regular blood screens for autoimmune disorders, may also be needed.

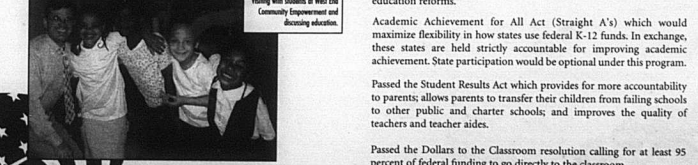
Education

As a member of the House Education Committee, Congressman Fletcher has consistently worked in Washington to give more flexibility to local schools, teachers and parents. A strong advocate of returning more control and dollars directly to local classrooms, he is pleased that Congress successfully passed Ed-Flex during his first session in the United States Congress.

Congressman Fletcher has been effective in ensuring that local schools and parents are empowered, that America has the best and

safest schools, that more dollars are returned directly to the classrooms and that technology is readily available to educate our children. Just as importantly, Congress is assuring that education receives more money than in the past and that educational dollars don't get lost on their way to our local classrooms.

In April, Congressman Fletcher brought the House Education Committee to Lexington to hear directly from local parents, educators and leaders as to how the committee could best address the needs of children throughout the Commonwealth and Central Kentucky. By working directly with folks in the 6th Congressional District, Fletcher has been successful in delivering education reform that will assure no child is left behind in the 21st Century.

Education achievements Congressman Fletcher has fought for and achieved:

- SMALLER CLASSROOMS: Secured funding for 100,000 new teachers, while including flexibility for local communities.
- LOCAL FLEXIBILITY FUNDING AND CONTROL: Passed Education Flexibility legislation which allows states and school districts greater flexibility - with accountability - in trying innovative education reforms.
- Academic Achievement for All Act (Straight A's) which would maximize flexibility in how states use federal K-12 funds. In exchange, these states are held strictly accountable for improving academic achievement. State participation would be optional under this program.
- Passed the Student Results Act which provides for more accountability to parents; allows parents to transfer their children from failing schools to other public and charter schools; and improves the quality of teachers and teacher aides.
- Passed the Dollars to the Classroom resolution calling for at least 95 percent of federal funding to go directly to the classroom.
