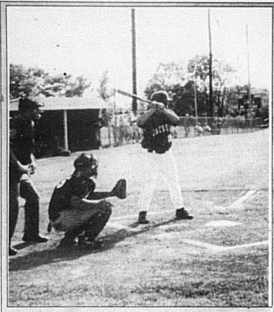

Paris Sailor plays vital role in success of the 'Silent Service'

Knifing their way deep below the ocean's surface, quiet and undetectable to the world above, American submarines are on patrol around the world, 24 hours a day, every day of the year.

Without Sailors like Paris' Chad P. Gordon, Navy submariners could not maintain the level of readiness necessary to meet the missions required of them by the president and other military leaders.

Other missions of the 360-foot long Los Angeles-class Cheyenne range from intelligence collection and special forces delivery to anti-sub and strike warfare against land-based targets.

The Cheyenne, which is capable of speeds in excess of 25 knots (29 miles per hour), is armed with Tomahawk cruise missiles and MK-48 torpedoes.

The safety record and mission success of the submarine force, among the highest in the Navy, is a credit to the attention-to-detail and focus submariners incorporate in their training and daily routine.

As the number of submarines in the U.S. arsenal continues to dwindle, Gordon and his fellow submariners experience and skills will be heavily relied on to keep the Navy's submarine force prepared to protect America's interests on a moment's notice.

As a nuclear plumber, Gordon, a 1997 graduate of Bourbon County High School, works on pumps and valves in a secondary plant and primary plant to a nuclear reactor to ensure Cheyenne is able to carry out its mission.

With the level of technology rapidly advancing, submarine Sailors must receive some of the best training in the world in order to maintain the tactical edge over opposing forces.

Throughout the year, attack submarines like Cheyenne are forward deployed with aircraft battle groups or operate independently in the most unstable regions of the world.

A number of Third World countries are acquiring modern state-of-the-art nuclear submarines, and soon.
