 June 23 is the deadline for signing up for some individual and all team sports, including basketball, soccer and softball. The deadline for most other individual sports will be June 30.
 Runners who want to participate in the 5-K Road Race will have until July 7 to register and the deadline for fencing will be Aug. 11.
 The Games will kick off on the weekend of July 14-16 with a limited schedule of events.
 Opening ceremonies will be held July 21 and most of the Games will follow on the weekend of July 22-23. Fencing competitions will be held Aug. 26 this year in Louisville. Most of the Games will be played in Lexington and surrounding counties.

 Archery; Bowling; Canoeing/Kayaking; Chess; Cycling; Disc Golf; Golf; Horseshoes; Martial Arts; Power Fumbling; Racquetball; Sailing; Shooting; Swimming; Table Tennis and Field; and Wrestling.

 ORDINANCE NO. 7, 2000

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2000 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2001 BY ESTIMATING REVENUE AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT

Be it ordained by the City of Carlisle:
WHEREAS, a budget proposal and message has been prepared and delivered to the City Council; and
WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed such budget proposal and made necessary modifications;
NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE,

Section 1. The City of Carlisle hereby adopts the following budget for Fiscal Year 2000-2001, for July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001, estimating revenues and appropriating funds as follows:
