miles unless approved by the Board of Education. Principals and Councils shall exercise control over the number of trips taken by each grade level and teacher.

Each group or school scheduling a trip shall reimburse the Transportation Department, by check, for the total miles driven at a rate of 92 cents per mile. All reimbursements shall be made on a monthly basis.

Athletic trips will be permitted the last two weeks as needed and will be allowed dismissal before schools out as long as a certified bus driver is available.
