'Jackets pound 'Hounds

Fryman throws 3 scores, picks off & runs another

The Nicholas County football Blue Jackets had to rally from a score down last Friday night to wrap up the Class A District 6 championship over the Greyhounds in Paris, 34-16. Head Coach Greg Letcher's squad wrestled away the momentum from the hosts on the ceremonial Senior Night to get the come-from-behind win and the opportunity to host this week's first round of the State Playoffs.

Richard Reid hauled in a 30-yard touchdown pass from senior quarterback Josh Fryman for the game's first score, but the Greyhounds had

the stands hollering, "who let the dogs out, woof, woof!" with a pair of back-to-back scores by Bruce Shaw to take a 13-7 lead by the end of the first quarter.

With the Greyhounds leading and a quick couple of flags on the Jackets forced the blue-and-white visitors to turn up the intensity.

"We had to suck it up and play a little bit," Fryman told *The Carlisle Mercury*. And our 15-yard unportsmanlike penalties didn't help us any — Paris was playing with a lot of adrenaline on their home field for Senior Night.

Need heat, but can't afford it?

Some residents of Fayette, Bourbon, Harrison and Nicholas counties are buried under the weight of many bills and are having to choose which basic necessities to purchase. Of these basic necessities which include medicine, clothing, food, heat is often one of the many ones they decide to forego.

A federally funded program, the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LHEAP) can help ease the situation. LHEAP is an energy assistance program, administered by Community Action Council. Eligible households may access one time assistance during the application period of November 6, 2000 to December 13, 2000. A utility shut-off notice is not required.

In Fayette County, applications will be accepted Monday through Thursday between 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Saturday from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Applications are accepted at other times by appointment. In Bourbon, Harrison and Nicholas counties, hours are from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. with appointments available after 4:30 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. All signed in by closing time will be seen that day.

The application locations are •913 Georgetown Street, Lexington •125 High Street, Suite 123, Paris •Community Service Center, 217 Old Lair Road, Cynthiana, and •149 Scrub Grass Road, Carlisle.

Applications will be taken in alphabetical order based on the first letter of the head of household's last name. The order is listed below.

The first letter of the last name on the dates listed below is when you should apply. A-November 6, B-November 8 and 9, C-November 13 and 14, D & E-
