The Headquarters Church will have their Thanksgiving Dinner on Wednesday, November 18, 2009 at 6:30 p.m.

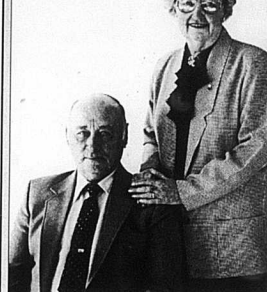
Rev. Roy Hunt of Maysville will be the speaker. Everyone is expected to come join them for dinner and fellowship.

People learn and people change

Almost any child who ever attended a Sunday School knows the story of Zachaeus who climbed up in a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus. At least that is the part of the story the children know.

It all began when Jesus spotted Zachaeus in high perch and said, "Come down, for I must stay at your house today." That started the rest of the crowd buzzing and murmuring. Zachaeus was a tax collector, and rich; he was a "sinner" in the eyes of most who lived in his world but Jesus came to save sinners, not to condemn them and in that day as well as ours that always offends respectable people! A wall goes up immediately because we don't want to seem to be one of the "sinners" so we scorn those who obviously are. And now comes one of the real, if subtle, points of the story.

In mercy Jesus breaks down the walls that divide us from one another; he unites the rich and the poor, people of all shades, the lame and the spry, the bright and the blind, the loyal and the disloyal; all are reconciled. Perhaps we too should climb with Zachaeus above the press of the crowd and catch sight of Jesus who came to make each person whole. Perhaps we too could learn to erase within us the tendency to blot out all that makes one person different from another and to not shun those who are different as if only those who are just like us have anything worthwhile to offer.

Maybe with Zachaeus and his neighbors we could learn to see how God has many strokes with his brush and blends hues and highlights shadows and harmonizes subtleties.

Zachaeus learned; he changed. Maybe he too could learn to seek out those whom society has abandoned and be quick to recognize their dignity and to affirm their uniqueness as a child of God and to assist them in their quest. "For the Son of Man we could even learn to welcome sinners as we have been welcomed by Jesus." In the Gospel (Luke 19:10) the story ends with a wonderful conclusion: "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

CITY OF CARLSILE
ORDINANCE NO. 10-2000
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 21.21 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO CHANGE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION, DELETING THE EX FICIO MEMBER TO MEET THE DECISION IN LAGRANGE COUNTY CITY V. HALL BROTHERS COMPANY BY THE KENTUCKY COURT OF APPEALS.

CITY OF CARLSILE
ORDINANCE 12-2000
AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF CARLSILE, TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF BODY ARMOR FOR THE SWORN POLICE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF CARLSILE, POLICE DEPARTMENT, PURSUANT TO THE KENTUCKY BODY ARMOR PROGRAM, AND AMENDING THE 2000-2001 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET TO REFLECT RECEIPT OF AND APPROPRIATION OF THE GRANT FUNDS UPON RECEIPT OF THE GRANT.
Be it ordained by the City of Carlisle:
Section 1. That the Mayor, on behalf of the City, be and he/she is authorized and directed to execute a Memorandum of Understanding, Two-party agreement, with the Office of the Governor, Department for Local Government, which agreement is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, for the receipt of grant funds for the purchase of body armor for the sworn police officers of the City of Carlisle.
Section 2. That the 2000-2001 Annual Budget Ordinance is amended to reflect the grant funds, upon receipt, as provided for and appropriating the like sum for purchase of body armor.
Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and approval and publication as required by law.
