Pastor's Pen

Compassion and commitment.....

Listen to the words of Jesus, Luke 9:23 and He said to them all, if any man come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow me. These are hard words for us to hear, for who wants to get on a cross and die everyday. The meaning really is that all of us who desire to follow after Jesus can only do it if we are willing to die for our own desires and ambitions, and become willing to do it God's way. What would make anyone want to take a cross everyday?
First, I believe there is compassion. Jesus did not have His life taken away from Him by force. He gave it willingly. He told Pilate the truth, that He had no power to take His life from Him. He was His choice to go to the whipping post and receive the stripes. It was His choice to carry the cross outside Jerusalem and allow them to nail Him there. If He desired, twelve legions of angels stood ready to do away with this man and destroy all of the inhabitants of earth lifting Him to safety from the mocking crowd. As He hung there of His own free will. He saw more than a mocking crowd, more than the Roman soldiers gambling at His feet, and more than the smug faces of the religious elite. He looked beyond that day and saw your face and mine, and He knew there was no way for us to get to heaven except that He would die in our place. Compassion is what held Jesus there that day and it should drive the church today. There are people who are lost without a way out unless someone reaches down and helps them up.
Secondly, there is commitment. As he hears the alarm go off at 5 a.m., it's cold and dark but he drags himself out of a warm bed. He gets ready, fights his way through the rush hour traffic, works overtime, fights his way back home, takes little Billy to the game, and little Nancy to the music recital.
He then gets home in time to get in bed and the next day he does it all over again. Why does he do it? He's committed to his family. He goes beyond what his own desires are because he cares what happens to his wife and kids. That's the way the Lord is. He went beyond His own comfort zone and would not stop. He is still committed to His family, to see to it that their needs are met.
We who are Christians can't quit because we know others are depending on us. If we do not finish the mission we were assigned from birth someone else may miss heaven. Like it or not, others are counting on you to show them your faith is real and that it works for you.
Thirdly, I believe consecration will drive us to take up our cross everyday. Consecration simply means to get to the place in God that there is no turning back. God is calling you today to consecrate your life to Him so that there is no possible way you can turn back. I watched the brave Americans board the Challenger thinking they were on their way into space to help mankind by the experiments they would do in space.
About two minutes after the giant engines roared to propel them into space, many
