Where are the animal laws?

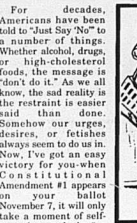
I was driving home the other day...

I know I'm not the only person who has seen this case. I have had several calls here at the office pertaining to this cow.

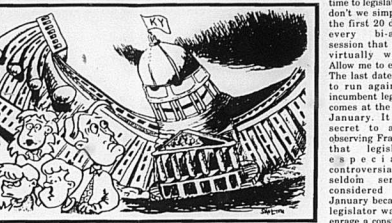
My final two cents... For what it's worth, the people struggle everyday to take care of themselves.
