AN ORDINANCE LEVYING CITY OF CARLISLE AD VALOREM TAXES FOR GENERAL MUNICIPAL PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2000 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2001 ON MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE TAXING JURISDICTION OF THE CITY OF EACH ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLARS OF JANUARY 1, 2000 ASSESSED VALUATION; EIGHTEEN CENTS (0.18).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE:

Section 1. That for the purpose of support of the government of the City of Carlisle, and the payment of its debt and expenses for the Fiscal year July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001, there be and hereby are levied ad valorem taxes on each one hundred (\$100.00) dollars of the January 1, 2000 assessed valuation by the Nicholas County Property Valuation Administrator of all taxable motor vehicles within the jurisdiction of the City as follows: eighteen cents (0.18).

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 8, 2000

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING CITY OF CARLISLE AD VALOREM TAXES FOR GENERAL MUNICIPAL PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2000 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2001 ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE TAXING JURISDICTION OF THE CITY OF EACH ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLARS OF JANUARY 1, 2000 ASSESSED VALUATION, AS FOLLOWS: ON REAL PROPERTY AND PERSONAL PROPERTY INCLUDING RECREATIONAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY OF PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANIES, EXCEPT MOTOR VEHICLES, EIGHTEEN CENTS (0.18); ON INSURANCE CAPITAL, EIGHTEEN CENTS (0.18); ON UNMANUFACTURED PRODUCTS NOT IN THE HANDS OF THE PRODUCER, EIGHTEEN CENTS (0.18).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE:

Section 1. That for the purpose of support of the government of the City of Carlisle, and the payment of its debt and expenses for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001, there be and hereby are levied ad valorem taxes on each one hundred (\$100.00) dollars of the January 1, 2000 assessed valuation by the Nicholas County Property Valuation Administrator of all taxable property within the taxing jurisdiction of the City as follows:

a. Real property and personal property, including real and personal property of public service companies on the Department of Revenue assessed valuation, except motor vehicles, eighteen cents (0.18).

b. Insurance capital, eighteen cents (0.18).

c. Unmanufactured products not in the hands of the producer or the agent of the producer, eighteen cents (0.18).

Section 2. All ad valorem taxes shall be paid to the City Clerk, and are levied for general fund purposes.

Section 3. All taxes paid by October 31, 2000 will be allowed a two (2%) percent discount. All taxes not paid before December 31, 2000 shall be assessed a six (6%) percent penalty. In addition, interest at the legal rate and charges for advertising delinquent tax lists shall be assessed on all delinquent taxes.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
