## Census reported incorrectly

According to Don R. Hassall, assistant executive director with the Bluegrass Area Development District, the census numbers in the April 5 issue of the Carlisle Mercury were reported wrongly.

His report said that Carlisle had grown by 17 percent. In 1990, the population in the city was 1,639. In 2000, the number of residents totaled 1,917.

That's a growth of 278 residents in the city.

In Nicholas County, the 1990 census reflected a population of 6,725. In 2000, the number of residents grew to 6,813.
