CITY OF CARLISLE ORDINANCE 5-2001

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TO THE CITY PROPERTY OF THE CITY OF CARLISLE AND USED FOR THE CITY WATER TREATMENT PLANT UPON THE CONSENT OF THE CITY TO THE ANNEXATION, AND GENERALLY SITUATED EAST OF THE CITY, URBAN IN NATURE, AND GENERALLY SITUATED EAST OF THE CITY.

Section 1. That the City hereby annexes to the City boundary that certain tract of land east of the City and lying south of the ROW of the City, containing 16 acres, more or less, which property is owned by the 13, containing 16 acres, more or less, which property is owned by the City of Carlisle, Kentucky and is adjacent to the City Water Treatment Plant.

Section 2: That the property is adjacent to the City, urban in nature, and is desirable for such use as residential.

Section 3: That the owner of the property to be annexed, City of Carlisle, Kentucky has executed an Affidavit of consent to Annexation, and through its duly authorized Mayor, and has requested the City of Carlisle to annex its property.

Section 4: That the tract annexed is more particularly described in Annex A, Legal Description, City of Carlisle, Kentucky Annexation, and through its duly authorized Mayor, and has requested the City of Carlisle to annex its property.

Section 5: That the zoning for such annexed tract shall remain Governmental.
