A Nicholas County high School student was killed in a two-vehicle accident Sunday on KY 3293, 26 miles from Cynthiana, police said. According to the Kentucky McCoy, 16 and a junior at Nicholas County High School, was operating a 1988 Chevrolet Beretta east on Millersburg Fike at around

9:50 p.m. and crossed the centerline into the path of a 1993 Chevrolet truck, driven by Gregory L. Roberts, 36; resulting in a head-on. The Harrison County Sheriffs office, Harrison County Fire Department responded and McCoy was declared dead at the seene as a result of her injuries, Roberts sustained injuries, but police did not say how he was injured.

A Kentucky State Police reconstruction acidled to the seene and alcohol is not suspected as a factor in the accident. Neither driver was wearing their seatbelt.
