Farmers should be aware of pipelines

This is the time of year when many farmers start preparing their fields for planting. A common agriculture technique used by Kentucky farmers to help aerate their fields and make them more productive is to use a specialized, heavy type of plow called a subsoiler. In certain areas, foresters are also using subsoilers to prepare timberlands prior to planting pine seedlings. The subsoilers are equipped with heavy tines that can turn the ground 18 to 24 inches or more below the surface.
White subsoiling can produce healthier plants and higher crop yields, it can also be very dangerous to an equipment operator, whose heavy equipment might hit a

pipeline right of ways in areas where they are working".
