

Morehead man to perform at Crossroads Live Aug. 31

Traditional musicians, including a singer-songwriter, will perform during Morehead State University's 'Americana Crossroads Live' on Friday, Aug. 31, at 7:30 p.m. in Duncan Recital Hall on the campus.

The concert, which is free and open to the public, will feature Russ Ward, the Licking River Ramblers, and Billie Jones and Cumberland Gap. The show is part of a series presented by WMKY 90.3 FM, NSU's public radio to the mountains, and the University's Kentucky Center for Traditional Music (KCTM).

Russ Ward of Morehead is a singer-songwriter who has been performing for 29 years. He has played guitar with several different bands,

including a singer-songwriter, ranging from folk to Bluegrass to rock 'n' roll.

Ward was featured at the 2000 International Bluegrass Music Association's 'Americana Songwriter's Showcase' in Louisville, He is working on his first solo album titled 'Life Lessons,' which features 12 original compositions.

This will be his second appearance on 'Americana Crossroads Live.' His first performance was last December at the inaugural performance of the Licking River Ramblers, a student band sponsored by KCTM. This band has made numerous appearances in the area. Members of the group are Roger Coleman and Steve Goff, both of Shelbina, J.T. Cure of Elk Horn City and Steve W. of Bethel.

Man critically hurt in accident

A Morgan County man was in critical condition last week following a one-vehicle accident on KY 711, about 8.5 miles north of Wrigley, police said.

Kentucky State Police said Daniel O'Connor, 19, was traveling south on KY 711, when he topped a rise in the road and failed to negotiate a curve. His vehicle then left the right side of the road, entered

a field and came to a rest as it struck a tree. Morgan Emergency Medical Service extracted O'Connor from his 1988 Dodge truck by use of the jaws of life. He was then airlifted to the University of Kentucky Medical Center.

A Morehead man and an Elliott County woman were both injured in a two-vehicle accident on KY 7 in Sandy Hook on Friday, Aug. 17, around 2:30 p.m., according to police.

Kentucky State Police said Miranda Porter, 17, was in a 1994 Oldsmobile, traveling north on KY 7, when she attempted to turn into the Penny Mart parking lot. She apparently failed to yield right-of-way to a 1996 Chevrolet S-10 pickup, driven by Julius Blair, 37, of Morehead, and struck his vehicle head-on.

Both Porter and Blair were treated and released from St. Clair Medical Center. Porter was not wearing a seatbelt, Blair was wearing a seatbelt, according to police.
