County sued over commandments

By KIM HAMILTON News Editor. The Ten Commandments being hung in the Rowan County courthouse is a violation of the U.S. Constitution, according to the American Civil Liberties Union. The ACLU filed a lawsuit this week against Rowan and three other Kentucky counties to request that public agencies stop posting the commandments in public buildings. Fiscal court voted unanimously nearly three years ago to post the Ten Commandments, said Rowan County Judge-executive Clyde Thomas. "There was not a lot of thought about it and not a single person approached me to say any other county officials to complain."

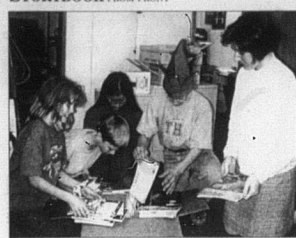
