**ORDINANCE NO. 1, 2001
AN ORDINANCE ENACTING AND ADOPTING A SUPPLEMENT TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CARLSLE, KENTUCKY**

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio has completed the Fifth supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Carlisle, which supplement contains all ordinances of a general nature enacted since the prior supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation has recommended the revision or addition of certain sections of the Code of Ordinances which are based on or make references to sections of the Kentucky Revised Statutes;

WHEREAS, it is the intent of Council to accept these updated sections in accordance with the changes of the law of the Commonwealth of Kentucky;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City of Carlisle:

SECTION 1. That the Fifth supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky, as submitted by American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, and as attached hereto, be and the same be hereby adopted by reference as if set out in full in this ordinance.

SECTION 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its date of passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
