The girls played really well, tonight," junior varsity coach Alicia Hughes told The Carlisle Mercury. "We took better care of the ball and it showed."

Gray and Fryman each put in 11 points in the 17-point win. Ashley Whalen added five points and Ashline Howard finished with four. Jenay Hunter and Ashton Markland rounded out the Nicholas County offense with one basket each.

The junior varsity Lady 'Jackets suffered a double-digit loss at Bourbon County Monday night of this week. Hughes said losing the ball too many times was the difference.

"The turnovers really hurt us," the coach said.

Fryman poured in a game-high 18 points to lead Nicholas County. Gray had seven and Howard scored four. Kellis Roberts and Hunter each added a bucket and Heather Treadway hit a free throw. Howard grabbed five rebounds in the 38-24 loss.

In varsity Lady 'Jacket action, Head Coach Nikki Smoot's club dropped both contests at Lewis and Bourbon.

Last Thursday, Nicholas County fell behind in the opening quarter, made a run, but couldn't quite overtake the Lady Lions. Treadway scored a dozen in the 60-49 loss and Whitney Massey added 11. Ashley Hamilton and Kari Beth Stacy each put in six and Howard had five.

Massey's four boards led what the coach described as a "terrible" team rebounding. "We were not happy with our rebounding effort," Smoot said.

Courtney Dale dished a

team-best five assists and Howard snagged three steals. Nicholas County committed 20 turnovers.

The rebounding got better, but the Lady 'Jackets again this week.

"Our rebounding got much better but we struggled on offense," Smoot said.

Massey had 11 points in the 62-35 loss. Howard dished four assists.

The girls opened play in the All 'A' Classic basketball tournament at Bishop Brossart last night (Wednesday). Nicholas County faced Silver Grove and a win would put them against St. Patrick/Deming Friday night in the semifinals.

Head Coach Bobby Starie's Nicholas County Blue Jackets lost at Bourbon County over the weekend and they had an off night Tuesday. The boys battle at Paris Friday night and compete in next week's All 'A' Classic at Bishop Brossart.
