

#### State property tax rate set at 13.6 cents

Kentucky Revenue Secretary Dana Mayton today announced that the 2001 state real property tax rate is 13.6 cents per each \$100 of assessed

value.

The rate is reviewed by the revenue cabinet and adjusted each year to ensure that, as assessments go up, the rate comes down to a level that limits any revenue increase to no more than four percent.
