



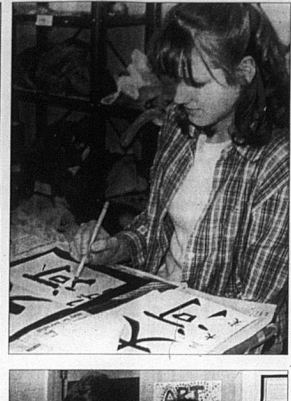

MEDICAID from 1 The costs and address the problem. But he stressed none of the options have been decided upon. "This is not the final deal," Ramsey said. "We are looking for input, we are looking for ideas." One option that is being discussed, Ramsey said, is intergovernmental transfers. In that process, money that has already been allocated to something else in the budget would be transferred to the Medicaid program. That would mean the state more money because the more that is in Kentucky's Medicaid program, the more money that will come in federal matches, Ramsey said. But, he said, the KYT had to be done cautiously. Any money the federal government gives in matching funds has to be used for the Medicaid program.

Both clubs dropped opening round games in the 37th District Tournament at Harrison County earlier this week. Bobby Stone's Blue Jackets, the tournament's defending champions, were shown the door by Harrison County in a 62-38 beating Tuesday night. A slow start by the Jackets, 18-9 in the first quarter but 16 gave the Throughbreds a double-point lead after the opening eight minutes. Nicholas County stayed even in the second period but Harrison County (14-14) won 26-14 at intermission. After the break, Throughbreds hunted any Jacket's lead of gaining the second round - a 20-8 third period put the game away. "It was just one of those nights and we couldn't do anything about it," Stone told The Carlisle Mercury. "The shots just didn't fall, we couldn't get to fall. I tried eight or nine different kids to see if we could get it going," the coach said. "But once you get down you've got to change your game plan and it really gets you out of what you want to be doing - it gets you out of sync."
