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**Unemployment reports for January**  
 Kentucky's unemployment rate underwent its usual January jump, increasing to 4.8 percent from December's 3.7 percent, according to the Department for Employment Services, a Cabinet for Workforce Development Agency.  
 Kentucky's rate in January 2001 was the same as in 2000's rate of 4.8 percent. The U.S. jobless rate also rose from 3.7 percent in December to 4.4 percent in January.  
 "This increase from December to January for Kentucky is as normal as snow in winter. The jobless rate this time of year in fact has risen the last 23 years. In fact, this 1.1 percentage point increase in Kentucky's rate for Jan. 2001 is less than the 1.4 percentage point average increase in the state's unemployment rate for the last 23 years," said Carlos Cracraft, the department's chief labor market analyst.  
 "Typically, Kentucky has its highest unemployment rates in January and February."  
 All of the nine major job sectors had employment increases in January, Cracraft said.  
 The trade sector reported the highest employment loss with 20,800 fewer jobs in January. About 19,000 of those jobs were in the retail trade sector, suggesting that the main decline was due mainly to the end of the holiday season or inclement weather, he said.  
 "However, the trade sector still had 5,900 more jobs in January 2001 than in January 2000," Cracraft said. "Notable over-the-year job gains occurred in areas such as eating and drinking establishments (2,800) and miscellaneous retail establishments (1,700)."

**Spring forest fire season begins**  
 Seasonal restrictions on outdoor burning are back in effect. The Kentucky Division of Forestry announces the start of the Spring Forest Fire Hazard Season, which runs through April 30.  
 During the hazard season, KRS 140.400 prohibits burning in or within 150 feet of any woodland or brushland, except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.  
 Uncontrolled debris burning (trash, leaves, yard waste, etc.) and arson cause the majority of the forest fires in Kentucky.  
 While burning is allowed between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m., one should conduct outdoor burning unless the air is calm and there is adequate moisture in the air and ground to prevent the spread of fire. It is illegal to start a fire at any time of the year without taking all reasonable precautions to prevent fire spreading. Reasonable precautions include clearing the ground around a fire and having tools and water readily available.  
 The law also requires that all outdoor fires be attended until fully extinguished.  
 Prior to outdoor burning, please check with the Kentucky Division for Air Quality, the Kentucky Division of Waste Management and your local agencies to ensure that you are obeying all outdoor burning laws.
